THEME OF THE WEEK: The Discipleship Preserved and Perfected by the Spirit

We remain incredibly weak creatures after our conversion. Sin still clings to us and will continue to cling to us until death. Therefore, it is comforting for the Christian to know that the Holy Spirit preserves the Christian throughout his sojourn and perfects him in death. We see our weakness in that we cannot fulfill the Law of God perfectly, even after our conversion. We see how the Spirit works through the Word of God in Psalm 119. We see how, even today, God sends us Spirit-filled preachers like John the Baptist and that through them, we are planted in the courts of the Lord. Finally, we see our perfection in Romans 8.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 6:36-42: Specks and Planks

The Law of God is not truly kept without faith. We are called to be merciful as God our Father is merciful. Unfortunately, our affections are not pure or holy. We judge others by our own standards. We look down on sinners who struggle while we stand under the same condemning Law. Often we use God's Law, not as a bright mirror to show others their sin and lead them to their Savior, but as a club to beat down them. But the Holy Spirit forgives our ungodly affections and evil deeds for the sake of Christ's sacrifice. And, being converted, our affections are renewed to love and serve our neighbor. *Holy Spirit, forgive us our false judgments and make us merciful as our Father in heaven is merciful. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:25-32: God's Word is our Great Heritage

This portion of Psalm 119 goes well with Sunday's lesson. The penitent knows how spiritually impoverished he is. He lies in the dust. He knows that, apart from God's help, he will be put to shame. And what is God's solution? In what can a man find help? In God's Word. The Scriptures vivify, they give new life to the spiritually dead. The Word of God removes lying from our mouths and sets God's truth before us. The Word of God enlarges our heart, so that we might truly love our neighbors, removing the specks from their eyes. Dear Christian, no better advice can be given than this: Find your comfort and your riches in God's Word. *Holy Spirit, You have caused Scripture to be written for our learning. Lead us in the study of God's Word. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Romans 8:18-23: Preserved and Perfected

This world is hard for the children of God. There is pain and suffering, a consequence of the Fall. Even creation groans under the heavy hand of sin. Animals, who originally ate only vegetation, now slaughter one another. Death and corruption are so pervasive that many are led astray. They think that death is a necessary component to how the universe works, i.e. Evolution. But we have been redeemed by the blood of Christ. On the last day, we shall be freed of the corruption caused by sin. In the meantime, we eagerly wait and hope. *Lord Jesus, You have redeemed our bodies. Come quickly and free us from the bond of corruption. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 58:6-12: The Fruit of Repentance

The people of Isaiah's day thought that going through the motions of religious exercises was enough. But without repentance, sorrow over sin and faith in Christ, outward actions count for nothing. God through Isaiah points out what the fruits of repentance look like. These fruits are not in following the ceremonial law, at least in this section. On the contrary, the fruits of repentance look like the second table of the Law, loving your neighbor as yourself. Only the Holy Spirit can bring about true repentance, so that we can love and serve our neighbor as God commands in this chapter. The Spirit creates and gives undeserved rewards for such fruit. *Lord Jesus, create in us true repentance so that we may love our neighbor as Isaiah illustrates. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 5:43-48: Be Perfect

Be perfect as God our heavenly Father is perfect. That's impossible. How can we love those who hate us? How can we love those who have no loveable qualities? And yet, this is what the Law demands. The Law doesn't equivocate. The Law doesn't set conditions to its fulfillment. Do this, and you will live. But we cannot be perfect as our Heavenly Father is perfect apart from faith. Through faith, we receive Christ's perfect righteousness. He loves the unlovable. And because He first loved us, we love our enemies and we pray for our persecutors. *Lord Jesus, You showed Your love for us in Your sacrificial death upon the cross. Give us Your perfect righteousness. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Luke 1:57-80: John the Baptist: A Portrait of An Evangelical Preacher

Zacharias, by the power of the Holy Spirit, prophesied concerning his son, John. John's importance wasn't that he would do miracles. John's importance wasn't that he would be a great king. No, John's importance lay in the fact that he was the forerunner to Our Lord Jesus. John's job was to give knowledge of salvation by the remission of sins. What your pastor does is what John did. Your pastor teaches you. He gives you the knowledge of salvation. He gives you the forgiveness of sins in so many different ways on Sunday morning and during the week. Thanks be to God that He sends us preachers like John the Baptist!

Heavenly Father, You sent John as a Forerunner of Jesus. Send us preachers who will teach and forgive. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 92: The Difference between the Faithful and the Faithless

This Psalm was used on the Sabbath. It is a response to the wonderful works of God. The Psalmist declares: "O Lord, how great are Your works!" And, we do! We thank Him for creation. We thank Him for our redemption through Jesus Christ. And we thank Him for our sanctification. These are God's mighty works. The fool, who says there is no God, cannot understand these things. The wicked will be destroyed forever. But those who are righteous by faith shall endure and bear fruit even in old age. May God grant that we are planted in church, in our Lord's house, so that we might be watered with the living water of the Spirit. *Heavenly Father, Your Works are great. Continue to work in us on Sunday morning and everyday. Amen.*
