### THEME OF THE WEEK: The Holy Spirit: Creator of the Church

We confess that God made all that is seen and unseen by speaking into the nothingness His creative word. ### SCRIPTURE: John 14:23-31: The Helping Spirit

The Holy Spirit is called the "Paraklete" in Greek. This can mean "Comforter", "Advocate", or "Helper". The idea is this; the Holy Spirit is here to do something for you. He comforts you with the message that your sins are forgiven and you have life in Jesus' Name. He is your advocate in that He takes your mumbling and unformed prayers before the Father. He is your helper in that He shows you the way of holiness in the revelation of Holy Scripture. We think of Jesus doing things for us. The Holy Spirit does the same. His work is for you. He continues to comfort, advocate, and help you always. *Dear Paraklete, be my helper always. Amen.*

### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 48: Zion, the Church of God

As you think about how God talks about Zion you can make the connection that He is also talking about His Church in the New Testament. The Church of God is where God makes Himself known as a fortress (v. 3), rulers are astounded at what God does there (v. 5), it is established forever (v. 8), the people will sing and rejoice (v. 10-11), and God will guide us forever (v. 14). Your Lord has made great promises to you and to all of His church on earth. We are to rejoice in all of His benefits to us and recognize that we aren't alone. Just as the Holy Spirit has kept you in this true faith, He keeps all of His church on earth. *Father, continue to bless my congregation and keep us faithful to Your Word. Amen.*

#### SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 4:7-11: The Use of Gifts

The Holy Spirit gives you a gift. The gift may be the same or different from those who are closest to you. Whatever that gift may be, God gives it to you to serve one another (v. 10). Using your gifts in this way is pleasing to the Lord. When you fail to love like Jesus loves, then turn to that love of Jesus and receive the forgiveness of your sins. Holy Spirit, give me the wisdom to use Your gifts for the good of others. Amen.
